Compliance status

The website has been tested against the Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) 2.2 AA standard.

This website is not compliant with the <u>Web Content Accessibility Guidelines version</u> <u>2.2</u> AA standard. The non-compliances and exemptions are listed below.

Non-accessible content

The content listed below is non-accessible for the following reasons.

Non-compliance with the accessibility regulations

- The Project page contains stages images and contributors images which do not have appropriate alt text. This fails WCAG 1.1.1 Non-text Content (A).
- Audio only content on the website does not have media alternatives. This fails WCAG 1.2.1 Audio-only and Video-only (Prerecorded) (A).
- Videos across the website do not have media alternatives. This fails WCAG
 1.2.3 Audio Description or Media Alternative (Prerecorded) (A).
- The language selection dropdown does not have a correctly associated label to identify function. This fails WCAG 1.3.1 Info and Relationships (A).
- The Method section of the Project page contains sub headings which are not programmatically marked as headings. This fails WCAG 1.3.1 Info and Relationships (A).
- The date information for resource tiles is not identified to screen reader users and is only available visually. This fails WCAG 1.3.3 Sensory Characteristics (A).
- Across the platform, links are differentiated from surrounding text by colour alone, and the focus for twitter buttons is shown by only a colour change. This fails WCAG 1.4.1 Use of Colour (A).
- The background illustration consisting of a busy image and gradient background colour can cause contrast issues with logos, links and other text at different magnifications. This fails WCAG 1.4.3 Contrast (Minimum) (AA).
- Page navigation and content does not respond to user triggered text size adjustments through methods such as OS or browser text/font size changes. This fails WCAG 1.4.4 Resize text (AA).
- Burger menus used for main and sub navigation do not respond well at higher magnifications and do not scroll correctly. This also significantly blocks the viewing of most page content across the website. This fails WCAG 1.4.10 Reflow (AA).
- At some magnification levels the footer obscures other logo content on the page. This fails WCAG 1.4.10 Reflow (AA).
- The SoundCloud player has some minor clipping for the privacy policy link. This fails WCAG 1.4.10 Reflow (AA).
- The SoundCloud player has multiple focus issues as keyboard users move through covering 1.4.1 Use of Colour (A), 2.4.7 Focus Visible (AA) and 1.4.11 Non-text Contrast (AA).
- Pages do not respond consistently to user-triggered text spacing adjustments.
 This fails WCAG 1.4.12 Text Spacing (AA).
- Important navigational elements including the burger menu, language selection and emergency exit control are not accessible to keyboard. This fails WCAG 2.1.1 Keyboard (A).
- There is no skip to content function on the website. This fails WCAG 2.4.1 Bypass Blocks (A).
- Many links across the website are not descriptive and use generic link text, or otherwise can be confused with other links. This fails WCAG 2.4.4 Link Purpose (In Context) (A).
- There is no other navigation routes for the website besides the main navigation which has accessibility issues. This fails WCAG 2.4.5 Multiple Ways (AA).

- There are some focus indication issues with navigation controls at higher magnifications. These can also cause some focus indication issues with content on certain pages. This fails WCAG 2.4.7 Focus Visible (AA).
- Because of navigation element issues at higher magnifications, on some pages content and its focus is obscured. This fails WCAG 2.4.11 Focus Not Obscured (Minimum) (AA).
- When the language selection dropdown is used, only the English setting results in the page having a language attribute. This fails WCAG 3.1.1 Language of Page (A).
- The SoundCloud player contains multiple incorrect elements with broken role attributes. This fails WCAG 1.3.1 Info and Relationships and 4.1.2 Name, Role, Value (A).
- Some navigation controls do not use the appropriate html elements and their function is not identified to users. This fails WCAG 4.1.2 Name, Role, Value (A).
